Dear Parent/Guardian.

As another school year draws to a close, I want to celebrate what we have achieved together. Inside and outside every lesson

At times, learning at school can be difficult for students and parents to manage. We know from experience that students and parents like to know exactly what to do to be successful, and what they're responsible for. To help with this, in the Autumn, we created and shared a clear *blueprint for success*, we call it **Every** Lesson.

Every lesson is a list of students' responsibilities inside and outside every lesson at Wickersley. We're certain that if students follow this blueprint - for every lesson, every day - they'll be successful. I have included a copy of Every Lesson with this letter.

Our home learning guide

This year, we wanted to improve students' experience of homework or home learning. In the early Spring, we produced a guide for students, teachers and parents to make sure there was a consistent approach to home learning across all subjects and year groups.

In summary, from now on, every week, all students, across all subjects and year groups, will be directed towards home learning by their teacher. Home learning tasks will vary. Home learning could include guizzes, assessments, or exam questions. It could also include activities which enrich students' learning, e.g., watching a documentary. Although students will be directed towards home learning weekly, these tasks won't always be compulsory. I have included a copy of our Home Learning Guide with this letter.

Change to mobile phone policy

Even the thought of a phone can make it hard for students to focus on learning. As a result, from the 1st of July, mobile phones were prohibited throughout the school premises, they should be **invisible at all times**.

Instead of a complete ban, we've struck a balance by allowing students to keep their phones turned off and stored safely in their bags. This minimises distractions while ensuring they're accessible when commuting to and from school.

I am proud to have seen such a smooth transition to our new policy. Almost all students are keeping their phones off and away during school hours, even in the policy's early days. This wouldn't be possible without your continued support and cooperation, thank you.

Our new uniform

Our uniform is important to us. It represents our school community and instils a sense of pride in our school. Our uniform also helps to set the tone for a productive day. We all know from experience that if we 'dress the part' for work, an interview or a big event, we feel more confident, professional and productive - able to focus on what matters.
